The Beijing Memorial Hall of the New Cultural Movement is found in the Red Building of Peking University (original site). The Memorial Hall comprehensively recounts the history of the New Cultural Movement with exhibits on the New Cultural Movement, reconstructed scenes, journals during the May 4th Movement in 1919, and videos. It is a vivid illustration of history starting from the birth of the New Cultural

Movement to the establishment of the Chinese Communist Party, with over 90 photos and over 60 artifacts. The former office of Li Dazhao, then the director of the Peking University Library, has been reconstructed on the

1st floor. The reading room, in which Mao Ze-dong once worked, along with the big classroom where Peking University students had classes, have also been restored to their original appearance. In the exhibition hall for periodicals, over 20 types of journals and magazines, published during that period and preserved by the National Museum of China, are now on display. Two feature TV films, *The May 4th Movement* and *Former Residences of Luminaries in the New Cultural Movement*, made by the Memorial Hall of the New Cultural Movement, are regularly shown in the video room.
